Healthcare

2. Free Education

Affordable University Education

Canadian citizens and Permanent Residents enjoy affordable university education. While an international student would pay full tuition fees, Canadians and Permanent Residents pay about half, or less than half, of those fees.





4. Canadian Child Tax Benefit

This is a monthly tax-free benefit administered by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and paid by the government to eligible families, to assist with the cost of raising children under 18 years of age.

5. Paid Maternity Leave

In Canada, you can enjoy a maternity leave period of 12 to 18 months and receive payment through Canada's Employment Insurance.

ARE YOU READY TO IMMIGRATE TO CANADA?

Here are six possible pathways to make the big move.

EXPRESS ENTRY

As the name implies, this is one of the fastest and easiest ways to immigrate to Canada. The three streams in the Express Entry process are the Federal Skilled Worker (FSW) stream, Federal Skilled Trade (FST) stream and Canadian Experienced Class (CEC) stream. You must meet the minimum requirements for one of these streams to be qualified to immigrate to Canada under the Express Entry Pathway. Requirements under these streams include proof of language proficiency (English/French), work experience, post-secondary degree or foreign educational credential assessment and proof of settlement funds (where there is no job offer). In the case of the Canadian Experienced Class (CEC) stream, applicants must have at least one year of work experience obtained in Canada.

2. PROVINCIAL NOMINATION PROGRAMS

Some provinces need people in certain occupations or investors to boost their economies. The Provincial Nomination Programs are immigration programs designed jointly by the government and the provinces, based on the need and requirements of the provinces with regard to immigrating skilled workers, business owners, students and workers as needed. The requirements for each of these programs vary from province to province.



3. STUDY

A number of Canadian universities rank as some of the world's best. Studying in Canada as an international student qualifies you to apply for a post-graduate work permit, after which you can apply for Permanent Residency upon working for at least a year. Requirements for studying in Canada include an admission/acceptance letter from a Designated Learning Institution (DLI) in Canada, a valid passport/travel document, proof of financial support including enough money to pay for tuition and living and travel expenses, proof of good health, and medical and police certificates.

4. WORK

Canada has many job opportunities and, to meet this need, often hires international skilled workers. A work permit is required to work in Canada; it could be either an LMIA-based work permit or an LMIA exempt work permit, depending on the nature of the job offer. After working for at least a year, you can apply for Permanent Residency in Canada. To apply for a work permit, among other requirements, applicants must prove that they are in good health, take a medical examination and not be a threat/danger to Canada's security.

START-UP VISA

Canada's start-up visa program targets immigrant entrepreneurs with the skills and potential to build businesses in Canada that are innovative, can create jobs and can compete on a global scale. Eligibility requirements include having a qualifying business, getting a letter of support from the designated angel investor group, venture capital fund or business incubator, presenting proof of financial commitment, meeting language requirements and presenting proof of settlement funds.

6. SPONSORSHIP

Do you have a relative in Canada? If your spouse is living in Canada, they can sponsor you to become a Permanent Resident through the Family Sponsorship program. Parents and grandparents can also be sponsored by citizens and Permanent Residents of Canada through the Parent and Grandparent (PGP) Sponsorship program. In addition, dependent children, adopted children or orphans can be sponsored depending on the circumstances.
